# **Future mining update**



Our MOD8 Extension application was placed on public exhibition late last year, with the majority of submissions supportive of the project. The project seeks to extend operations within the currently approved mining area until 2026, allowing more time for the State and Federal Governments to complete their assessments of the HVO Continuation project.

Following exhibition of the extension project, a response to submissions report was lodged with the NSW Department of Planning in January and the Department is in the process of making a final assessment.

The extension project will safeguard jobs for our workforce and give certainty to our contractors, community partners, and the businesses that rely on us for work in the region while we continue working with the Government on plans for long-term continuation of mining on the site.

Our proposal focuses on re-mining already disturbed land for a longer period, without increasing existing annual production volumes. This will allow us to sustain around 1,500 local jobs and continue injecting billions of dollars into local businesses, the community, and government revenue.

We appreciate the significant community support for this proposal that will require continued support over the next 18 months to protect local jobs, businesses, and our region's economic future.

# **Responsible Mining**

### **Ongoing Rehabilitation**



Rehabilitation at east Tailings Storage Facility

Rehabilitation of post-mined land is an important part of our operation. During 2024 we rehabilitated 69 hectares of land, reflecting our ongoing commitment to restoring land for future use.

In addition, 88.5 hectares of land in the Carrington area was seeded with final land use species, marking the completed rehabilitation of that area. Works have been wrapped up in our remediation of the WOOP dump area, with contour regrading and gypsum and compost application being our last completed activities.

Grazing of mature rehabilitation areas - approximately 1,000 hectares, by 2,000 head of cattle - is currently being undertaken to encourage and maintain pasture diversity, encourage nutrient cycling and assist in fuel load management.

Looking ahead, we've set a goal to rehabilitate an additional 55 hectares in 2025.

#### Weed management

Over the last few months we've had a significant focus on the management of weeds across our site. Our goal during this time has been to reduce weed proliferation in and around our priority areas of the Hunter River and Wollombi Brook. Weeds targeted included castor oil, balloon vine, green cestrum, galenia and inkweed, all of which can have significant effects on the native flora and fauna.

Unlike public roads, HVO's vehicle hierarchy follows sitespecific rules designed to keep all road users safe. Videos will soon provide clear, practical guidance on navigating intersections correctly, through a series of scenarios demonstrating the four Vehicle Hierarchy rules.

This investment in training is another step towards preventing incidents and strengthening our safety culture. The new videos will be live in the coming months. Stay tuned!
