




#### Comparative Rainfall: 2023 to 2025




#### Rehabilitation

- HVO has a 2025 rehabilitation target of 55.6ha of new rehabilitation and 10.8ha of GMD
- All rehabilitation has now been released, and shaping has commenced with 31.5ha being completed YTD. Shaping is expected to be complete by mid October 2025
- All GMD has had an initial weed spray completed with a follow up spray and seeding to be completed during Spring

#### Rehabilitation Maintenance

#### 2025 Rehabilitation maintenance works include:

- 2ha of infill planting at Wilton
- Relocation of habitat trees and translocation of two orchids from Mitchel Pit to WN230 rehab area
- Grazing of pasture rehabilitation commencing at Carrington
- Mulching of Acacia Saligna at Riverview
- Weed spraying of rehabilitation and topsoil stockpiles
- Minor erosion repairs

## **Biodiversity**

#### Crescent Head offset:

- Mapping of fence and track repairs needed after fire and flood
- Install brackish frog ponds to control Chytrid fungus
- Trial 'frog hotel' for Green and Golden Bell frogs
- Examine cattle damage

### Operational Weed Management

#### Activity focus:

- Ongoing management of African Olive and Lantana at the Hook Biodiversity Offset Area (BOA)
- Continued target spraying of weeds at the Mitchelhill BOA including Coolatai Grass, Pear and Galenia
- Reducing weed coverage and pig habitat within riparian areas (Hunter River and Wollombi Brook). Target weeds including castor oil, balloon vine, green cestrum, galenia and inkweed






## Vertebrate Pest Management

#### Autumn 2025 1080 baiting programme:

- Fifty-nine bait stations (295 baits) across HVO, with following takes:
  - Fox 28
  - Dog 19
  - Rabbit 1
  - Unknown 12
  - Total 61 (21% uptake)
- July pig baiting largely unsuccessful
- Pig trapping currently being undertaken with better results







### Vertebrate Pest Management

#### **Current Programmes**

- Pig trapping: July August
- HVO rural licensee feral pest bounty programme ongoing. Increased bounty
- Kangaroos cull yet to be conducted

#### Remaining 2025 activities

Synchronised baiting and trapping programs coordinated with other mine sites and Hunter LLS:

- Spring 1080 wild dog and fox
- Spring 'Hoggone' pig baiting
- Summer 1080 wild dog and fox




Figure 4: Location of Sub-Surface Machine Scrapes Within MPS AHIP Area




## **Blast Monitoring**

 No reportable exceedances occurred during the reporting period (Q2 2025)






## Air Quality Monitoring

#### 1 | EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

Hunter Valley Operations (HVO) is an opencut coal mine comprising HVO North and HVO South operations. It is located in Lemington, NSW, approximately 20km northwest of Singleton. HVO's Community Consultative Committee (CCC) is a forum for open discussions and information sharing between HVO and the community.

The HVO CCC operates in accordance with the Department of Planning and Environment (DPE) Community Consultative Committee Guidelines for State Significant Development Projects.

During the reporting period, the committee has performed its functions well and in accordance with the DPE CCC Guideline as well as the HVO CCC terms of reference. It provides an effective communication forum between community representatives, local Council and HVO.



- There is currently no surface exploration in Exploration Licences forecast for the remainder of 2025, however should this change, HVO will conduct consultation with impacted stakeholders


