

ACTION 4: In response to a query from Jeannie, Shaun to confirm detail around anticipated works behind the Ridge Line and potential timing for commencement








Truck Sound Attenuation

- First truck to be fitted with new attenuation package to be tested this week.








Reporting and Inspections

 - Follow-up inspection of areas related to reported water incidents in March

Reportable Incidents

18 March – Turbid water entered Farrells Creek from a rehabilitation slope


- High rainfall
- Low potential for environmental impact
- Repairs made to rehabilitation slope to prevent reocurrence
- Reported to EPA, DPE and RR
- EPA and RR investigating



Reportable Incidents

30 March – Turbid water entered Farrells Ck from two sediment dams

- High rainfall exceeding dam design capacity
- Low potential for environmental impact
- Pumps operated to lower dam levels
- Additional storage capacity created to reduce potential for reoccurrence
- Reported to EPA, DPE and RR



Complaints (2019) – as at 28 May



- Four complaints received for 2019 YTD
- 6 March 2019, 18:58
 - EPA Officer advised that a complaint had been received about HVO in relation to dust with the location described as being nearby to HVO.
 - Dust levels were high throughout the Hunter region on the day.
 - A number of actions were taken by HVO during the day to mitigate dust including working lower in the pit, equipment shutdown and postponing a blast.
 - In the late afternoon light rain fell and wind changed direction, blowing from the SE

• 29 April 2019, 11:44

- Complainant stated that they had received an automated SMS notification from the OEH in regards to dust readings from the Upper Hunter Air Quality monitor at Maison Dieu which had recorded 104.2 ug/m3 at 10am.
- The complainant had requested information in regards to what HVO were doing to manage dust.
- A follow up call was made at 13:07 by HVO with details of current dust management practices on site and explained that wind direction placed the monitor upwind of HVO.
- The Environment and Community Officer also explained that hazard reduction burns were taking place in the area and the smoke would impact the monitors as identified on the OEH website.


• 27 May 2019, 11.10am

- A complaint was received about observed high levels of dust on Lemington Road in the vicinity of West Pit around 10.30am
- A visual dust inspection was conducted at West Pit at 9.30am which confirmed that no equipment was running with no dumping visible. The OCE confirmed that operations had ceased at this time.
- A wind speed of 16.2m/s was recorded at the closest dust monitor to West Pit at the time of the complaint.
- Further dust inspections were carried out at 11.20am and 11.35am

• 27 May 2019, 11.20am


- Complaint received by a resident in Long Point who contacted the EPA about dust levels coming from the South operation at around 10.30am
- The majority of trucks, loading equipment and two draglines ceased operating at around 9.00am – 9.30am
- Five water trucks were in circulation
- A wind speed of 14.8m/s was recorded at the time of the complaint
- The blast scheduled for 1.00pm on 27 May in Cheshunt was rescheduled to 9.00am on 28 May

Equipment Downtime – 27 May (High Winds)



- Majority of equipment shut down by 9.30am
- Blast planned for 1pm postponed
- All available water carts operating



- 3 week autumn 1080 Wild dog/fox control program commencing 6th May
- 3 week spring pig trapping program, date TBA
- 2 -3 week spring 1080 Wild dog/fox control program, date TBA
- Kangaroo culling (commercial harvest ongoing)
- Open range shooting (on-going bounty system linked to commercial harvest program)

Objective


To achieve greater impact on feral animal populations by coordinating corporate and government agency programs
