
Ongoing Annual Action; HVO to present their yearly Local Procurement Spend data when that reporting is available (documented from minutes on 21 August 2019)

- During August 2020, HVO blasted on 14 dates
- 10 minute data availability was reviewed for each dust monitor (TEOM's) on each of the blasting dates
- Of the 14 dates only one blasting event correlates with dust monitors being offline.
- The Warkworth dust monitor was offline on 27 August from 8.30am and then was online again from 4.00pm due to an unplanned power outage
- Two shots were fired on 27 August at 9.12am and 4.56pm
- The Warkworth (Department of Environment, Energy and Science managed monitor) dust monitor was not online for the shot fired at 9.12am but was back online for the shot fired at 4.56pm
- Wind direction was 301 degree's (NW) at time of firing
- The Wandewoi dust monitor was online but missed five, 10 minute data point's from 9.20am to 10.00am
- Dust monitors that produce less than 75% daily dust data capture are reported to the DPIE
- The data mis-capture on 27 August was notified to DPIE on 31 August after it was confirmed that missed data could not be recovered



2020 volume extracted (to Q3) = 513 ML











## Reporting, Exceedances and Inspections







- Online survey received a total of 101 responses, of which:
  - 49 responses were from local residents,
  - 6 surveys within the area of reference (Hunter Valley and Newcastle) and
  - 46 were located interstate or internationally

#### **Approvals**

- Grant of two mining tenements ML1810 and ML1811
- The addition of these two tenements brings the total number of HVO tenements to 42





#### Insite update

- HVO will be closing down the Insite page which currently hosts the document library and operational data including dust data and operational downtime statistics
- Most of the information will be transferred to a new website page to align with other Glencore sites
- The insite "data" page was analysed for foot traffic over the period from 1 May 2018 to 3 March 2020 which found that on average there was less than one page view per day
- Given that this page is generating very little interest, HVO intends to remove this data.

#### Drilling – EL5291 and EL5606

- EL5606 HVO has completed the drilling of 20 of the proposed 29 drillholes
- At this stage there will be no drilling on EL5291 (including those drillholes proposed for private properties.

#### Heritage Update

- Hayshed repair works Archerfield Homestead completed August 2020
- Hunter Valley Operations Historic Heritage Register updated and finalised 24 September 2020.
- Termite Interception System inspections at LEP listed properties report no identified termite activity end October 2020
- Yard maintenance works at LEP listed properties completed 1st week November 2020
- Removal of tenants equipment from around Archerfield Stables progressing November 2020
- HVO planning for temporary onsite storage of Archerfield agricultural heritage items while repair/preservation works at the Archerfield Stables progress in the forthcoming year
- HVO calling quotes for reinstatement of security boarding following recent report of forced entry, but no damage at the Chain of Ponds Inn
