

Action arising from previous CCC meeting


Action 1: HVO to provide Continuation Project survey responses broken down to LGA.





Injury Rates (as at end January 2021)










Howick CHPP in care and maintenance






Carrington – as at November now TSF

















HVO Continuation Project – Update

- Scoping Report and request for Secretary's Environmental Assessment Requirements (SEARs) lodged with NSW Department of Planning, Infrastructure and Environment (DPIE) on 4th December
 - Working through method of test excavation of Aboriginal site CM_CD1 with Heritage NSW
- Application for Site Verification Certificate (SVC) lodged with DPIE on 24th December
 - Verifies not strategic agricultural land in areas where new mining lease is required
- Project referral to the Commonwealth Department of Agriculture, Water and Environment in preparation for lodgment this quarter
- Technical studies to support the Environmental Impact Statement (EIS) are well underway, with a number of draft reports due next month (March)
- Proposing to undertake further targeted community consultation to discuss outcomes of technical studies
- Documentation can be accessed on the Major Project Portal sites (maintained by DPIE)



- Development application and Statement of Environmental Effects submitted to Singleton Council for assessment




EL5606 and EL8821


• Five drillsites on EL5606 and the underlying EL8821 are proposed for 2021.

Program of activities 2021

- · Kangaroo culling (commercial harvest ongoing).
- Open range shooting (on-going bounty system linked to commercial harvest program)
- 2 Commercial Kangaroo harvests completed January 2021 (awaiting data)

Synchronized baiting/trapping programs, targeting pigs, wild dogs and foxes in conjunction with the LLS.

Summer

 1080 Wild dog/fox control program to commenced 1st February 2021 and scheduled to complete 19th February 2021.

Autumn

 1080 Wild dog/fox control program to commence on date to be confirmed with the LLS (likely May 2021)

Winter

 Hog —eye pig trapping program to commence on date to be confirmed with the LLS (likely July 2021)

Spring

- 1080 Wild dog/fox control program to commence on date to be confirmed with the LLS (likely September/October 2021)
- Increase mice baiting around office buildings. Awareness provided to employees and contractors about crib room cleanliness and removing food sources.

Activities undertaken in previous quarter:

Reinstatement of security boarding at Chain of Ponds Inn completed

Proposed activities:

- Planning for temporary onsite storage of Archerfield agricultural heritage items while repair/preservation works at the Archerfield Stables progress in the forthcoming year.
- Archerfield Stables structural works
- Yard maintenance works at LEP listed properties ongoing
- Termite Interception System inspections at LEP listed properties ongoing.

Reporting, Exceedances and Inspections

- EPA undertook an inspection on 21 January overall feedback was positive.
- Three areas requiring action included:
 - Pumping out the bulk fuel tank refuelling catch bund at the Orica explosive reload facility
 - Removing minor amount of ammonium nitrate spillage
 - Wheel generated dust from the coal stockpile
- All actions have been addressed

 Combined and revised Mining Operations Plan (MOP) submitted to Resource Regulator Dec 20



Community Information Sessions

- Community Information Sessions held in November and December at Jerrys Plains, Maison Dieu and Long Point
 - Issues raised by attendees included:
 - the realignment of Lemington Road as part of the HVO Continuation Project, noise, dust and feral animals
